SAMPLE BEQUEST LANGUAGE

| Type of Bequest | When to Use It | How to Say It |
|------------------------------------|--|--|
| General Bequest | Use this type of bequest if you wish to give Memory Matters a state sum of money. | "I give \$ to Memory Matters (Tax ID 58-2291775), Mailing Address: PO Box 22330, Hilton Head Island, SC 29925." |
| Percentage of Remainder Bequest | Use this type of bequest if you wish to give Memory Matters a percentage of what is left of your estate after caring for loved ones. | "I give to Memory Matters (Tax ID 58-2291775), Mailing Address: PO Box 22330, Hilton Head Island, SC 29925, a sum equal to percent of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate." |
| Contingent Bequest | Use this type of bequest if you wish to make a gift to Memory Matters only on the condition that a certain event must occur first. | "I give to \$ to my wife, Jane, provided she survives me; otherwise, I give to Memory Matters (Tax ID 58- 2291775), Mailing Address: PO Box 22330, Hilton Head Island, SC 29925. |
